Per NAC 504.421, at its May 5, 2023 meeting, the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners is required to approve an elk damage payment above \$10,000. An elk damage assessment on the Granite Peak Ranch in White Pine County, totaling \$28,346, was completed by Department personnel and submitted for reimbursement by Bruce Hubbard, agent for the property.
