Details:

*Exemptions from an IBD Establishment Permit

- Medical professionals working within the scopes of their practice at their place of work are exempt from these regulations and permit requirements.
- Establishments which only perform piercing of the earlobes with single use, pre-sterilized, stud-in-clasp ear piercing system (“piercing gun”) which is in compliance with the manufacturer’s directions and all applicable requirements of the US Food & Drug Administration must apply for an exemption.
- Exempt establishments must still use jewelry appropriate for initial piercings. If an exemption, they will be required to close until they can meet the full requirements of the current Sanitation Code and obtain an annual permit.
- The health authority retains the right to respond to complaints against exempt establishments and to periodically check for compliance.
